

LISTS OF PROHIBITED OBJECTS

CLASSIFICATION OF "OBJECTS" SUGGESTED FOR PROHIBITION

► Prohibited at the Air Show site



- Documents, tracts, badges, insignia and banners of any size, of a political, ideological, philosophical or advertising nature, and any media used for commercial purposes that can be seen by third parties (without authorisation).



- Any object that can be used as a projectile or weapon, either designed as such or that could endanger the public (knives, glass bottles, metal cans, metal bars, large-diameter rigid poles, sharp objects, etc).



- Any chemical substances, gases or aerosols designed to neutralise and incapacitate (such as tear gas).



- Sparklers, firecrackers, torches and candles, smoke bombs, Bengal lights, rockets and generally speaking any pyrotechnic items whose lighting, projection or explosion could cause an accident to the holder or third parties.



- Weapons of all categories (including caterers' kitchen knives and security officers' handguns).



- Suitcases, bags or briefcases larger than cabin luggage.



- Alcoholic drinks of all kinds.



- Hand tools.



- Any devices designed to emit a very loud sound (megaphones, whistles, rattles, foghorns, etc).



- Bottles of liquid or compressed gas (including oxygen bottles designed for people requiring respiratory assistance).



- Animals (except guide dogs for the blind and those needed to assist disabled people).



- Drones and generally speaking any remotely-controlled devices.



- Motorcycle helmets.



- Iceboxes.



▶ Laser pointers.



▶ Aerosols of any kind, including those containing deodorants or for medical use.



▶ Dummy or replica weapons (air guns; toy guns).



▶ Bottles larger than 50 cl containing liquids.



NOTE

Off-duty policeman do not have the right to wear their weapons at the Air Show.

MEASURES FOR PREVENTING ADMISSION AT THE SHOW GATES

The following may be prohibited from entering the Show:

- ▶ Anyone with an animal (except guide dogs for the blind, dogs assisting disabled people and sniffer dogs),
- ▶ Anyone in a state of inebriation,
- ▶ Anyone possessing any of the prohibited objects listed above who refuses to give them up,
- ▶ Anyone whose behaviour or clothing is incompatible with respect for other people's persons or sensitivity.

RULES FOR DEPOSITING OBJECTS

Objects forbidden to be carried or worn on the public highway (weapons, narcotic products) may not be deposited. The police will always be called in if such objects are discovered.

Objects of little value or whose use is evidently improper at an event like the Paris Air Show will not be returned.

Objects that are not claimed by their owners will be deposited at the City Hall lost-and-found department within 48 hours.

Animals may not be deposited.
