



WELCOME

TO THE PARIS AIR SHOW



The Paris Air Show (PAS) makes the safety and security of its Exhibitors a priority, working in close cooperation with the competent authorities and security forces. Safety measures are constantly reassessed and tested during dedicated exercises.

Some of these measures take visible form, like pat-downs at entrances; others are unobtrusive to ensure their effectiveness. This notice is designed to help you prepare for your visit to the Show by informing you of various regulations concerning safety and your own convenience during the visit.

**FOR YOUR SECURITY AND CONVENIENCE DURING YOUR VISIT,
WE ASK YOU TO COMPLY WITH THE FOLLOWING RULES.**

1. ACCESS TO THE SHOW



1.1 Access control

As well as pat-downs at the entrances, the PAS carries out inspections (either visual or with specific equipment) of your clothing, coats and other personal effects before you enter the Show.

If Exhibitors refuse to submit to pat-downs or visual inspections, **the PAS is within its rights to forbid access to the Show or its car parks.**

1.2 Prohibited objects

Please note that it is forbidden to take the following into the Show or its car parks:



Objects considered as weapons or potential weapons:

any category of weapon; any objects that could be used as projectiles (glass bottles, metal bars, etc.); any imitation or replica weapons; any portable workmen's tools (e.g. drill).



Dangerous inflammable objects:

any disabling or incapacitating chemical substances, gases or sprays (tear gas); any explosive or pyrotechnical materials or any other inflammable objects (firecrackers, torches, candles) and any bottles of liquefied or compressed gas (except on presentation of a medical prescription).



Consumables:

any type of drug, stimulant or psychotrope.



Objects that could disrupt the Show and disturb Exhibitors:

any documents, tracts, badges, insignia or banners of a political, ideological, philosophical, advertising or religious nature; any electronic or hand-operated sound instruments (megaphones, whistles, vuvuzelas, etc.); any flying objects or remotely controlled devices (drones); any laser pointers.



Suitcases, bags or briefcases of a size larger than that of the a carry-on baggage item:

only luggage with a capacity of less than 15 litres will be allowed within the Show.



Other objects such as:

motorcycle helmets; any telescopic poles for cameras or mobile phones or any object considered inappropriate or disturbing by the PAS.



WARNING

Any person refusing to submit to the various control systems set up at the entrance to the Show will be refused access to the Show or its car parks. In addition, any objects prohibited by law discovered during pat-downs or inspections will systematically entail the intervention of the security forces.

1.3 Bulky items

The introduction of voluminous and/or cumbersome objects (in particular suitcases, luggage and briefcases) into the Show or its car parks is prohibited within the premises of the Show. These items may be subject to inspection in car parks.

Objects exceeding the authorized limits may be deposited in free luggage lockers (Gates L and O). These luggage lockers are free of charge and available to all Exhibitors as long as they are available.



NOTE

We recommend that you come without these items or use the free luggage lockers provided for this purpose, located at certain entrances to the Show (Gates L and O).

1.4 Transportation equipment

Unless medical proof is provided, subject to compliance with the circulation constraints imposed by the Organiser, it is forbidden to access the Show on roller skates, bicycles, push scooters, skateboards, Segways® or any other transportation device, whether or not motorised.



1.5 Clothing

Suitable clothing is required during Trade Days. We would also advise you to adapt your clothing to the weather conditions, which can be difficult during the Show, e.g. storms or heatwaves.

The PAS also reserves the right at any time to refuse access to people, or have them escorted outside, if **they are wearing clothing, make-up or tattoos considered inappropriate by the PAS**, which could encourage interactions with other Exhibitors or visitors, or disturb them.

For security reasons, in application of the Circular of 2 March 2011 on the implementation of Act No. 2010-1192 of 11 October 2010 and Act 2019-90 of 10 April 2019 creating Article 431-9-1 of the Criminal Code prohibiting facial concealment in public areas, it is forbidden to wear clothing that totally or partially conceals the face, except for medical reasons (proof required).

 Failure to comply with these clothing regulations may mean that Exhibitors are refused entry to the Show or its car parks.

1.6 Minors

However old they are, minors are under the control of their parents or supervisors, who are responsible for any damage they cause.

1.7 Animals

Only service animals are admitted to the Show. They must be kept on a leash and supervised by their owners.



2. ACCESS TO THE BUILD-UP



As a reminder, the site is closed to the public.

Identity checks, vehicle visits and palpations may be carried out from time to time. On the other hand, a systematic control of your personal protective equipment will be set up at the entrances (wearing a high visibility chasuble and safety shoes), with the control of the badge which must remain visible at all times.

If you do not yet have your badges, a visitor badge can be issued at Gate L4, in exchange for an identity document and a business card.



3 HEALTH AND SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS



3.1 Exhibitors' behaviour

Generally speaking, members of the Exhibitor are requested to **avoid causing any disturbance during the Show through their attitude, clothing or what they say, and to respect safety instructions.**

The PAS may intervene and take the necessary measures in the event of:

- ▶ theft,
- ▶ public disorder,
- ▶ verbal or physical violence,
- ▶ offensive remarks,
- ▶ demonstrations,
- ▶ fraud,
- ▶ swindles,
- ▶ states of inebriation,
- ▶ offences against decency,
- ▶ malicious behaviour,
- ▶ failure to comply with safety instructions or this notice,
- ▶ secret and offensive surveillance of an Exhibitor or an exhibited product,
- ▶ any acts of deliberate destruction,
- ▶ racism, etc.



WARNING

The Show reserves the right to alert the police, file a complaint or escort Exhibitors outside the Show compound or car parks, without any compensation or refund being due to the Exhibitors concerned.

For safety reasons, it is forbidden to move around or run in a reckless manner.

To ensure a pleasant visit, we ask you to keep the venue and the installations clean. Waste bins are provided for this purpose at the exhibition site.

3.2 Evacuating the Show premises

The PAS management reserves **the right to restrict or refuse access** to the Show, and to evacuate all or part of the Show for safety reasons.

3.3 Theft and damage to Exhibitors' property

The PAS is **not responsible for the theft or loss of your personal objects or damage to them** within the Show compound and car parks.



NOTE

We recommend using the free left luggage facilities at Gate L and O, and never to leave any valuable objects unattended.

3.4 No smoking or vaping



Smokers and steamers are not allowed enclosed areas, the Static Display area, the General Public grandstand and Chalet terraces.

3.5 Video Protection

The Show site is equipped with a video protection system operated by the PAS and the competent authorities. This video protection system is used for **the safety of people, property and premises**. The PAS is responsible for the management of the system according to current legal provisions (articles L223-1 to L223-9 and L251-1 to L255-1 and R251-1 to R253-4 of the internal security code). The images are kept for 30 days and can be viewed in the event of an incident by security personnel and the police. You also have the possibility of sending a complaint to the CNIL.

3.6 Right to the image

Each Exhibitor accepts the shots made during the Show and **authorizes the PAS to use, reproduce and distribute his image, for the presentation and commercial promotion of the PAS**. Each Exhibitor authorizes the PAS to use, reproduce and diffuse these views for institutional brochures, commercial documentations, press and advertising publications on websites and all media. This authorization is granted for 5 years after the end of the Show.

3.7 Lost and abandoned objects

A Qik Objects team will be present at the Show to register lost and found items online.

4. ACCESSIBILITY TO THE SITE



4.1 Exhibitors' commitment

For safety reasons, accessibility to the site requires **good health and a sound physical condition** given the extent of the exhibition areas (over 70 ha), and weather conditions that are sometimes difficult in June (storms or heatwaves). We invite you to adapt your outfit accordingly and to equip you with a cap to protect you from the sun. Rest areas are provided, and we suggest using them as often as possible.



Consequently, all Exhibitors should check their state of health before coming to the Show and take note of any warnings, access conditions and safety rules by reading the brochures, the Show website (www.siae.fr) and information indicated at the entrance to the Show site, in the guides, by the Show staff and at information points.

Restrictions based on these health and safety requirements in no way constitute discriminatory measures.

4.2 Pregnant women and disabled persons

They are not exempt from safety measures, but **may call on one of the Show doctors** at the entrance if pat-down procedures are problematic.



NOTE

People who are permanently or temporarily disabled or who wish to enter with medical or paramedical equipment (crutches, respiratory devices with air cylinders, etc.) may be required to present appropriate medical proof to gain admittance to the Show.

4.3 Closure of the site

The PAS reserves the right **to close the Show without notice before the official closing time.**

In addition, the PAS may start evacuating the Show 15 minutes before the normal closing time given the extent of the site.

This also applies during build-up and dismantling.

4.4 Special case of Sunday 16 June, the pre-opening day

Build-up badges are no longer allowed (pedestrians and vehicles). Permanent Exhibitor badges are allowed as in the build-up.

1-day Exhibitor badges are allowed and not counted.

Gate L is still free of access but Gates M, 52 and 53 are functional for those with rights (see Access & Traffic Guide), and this from 7am and not before.

Thus the delivery times of the Show start this Sunday at 7am and not before.

The security checks carried out at all access points will be the same as during the Show: palpation, opening of luggage and parcels, vehicle visits. We therefore invite you to reduce any assembly activity during this day.

Small tools and loads on wheels or hand trucks will still be allowed on that day only but checked at the entrances. You should therefore plan to wait if you are in this situation.

The direction of traffic in the cottage line is reversed.

4.5 Special case of the dismantling night

The Show is accessible to pedestrian build-up/dismantling badges on Sunday 23 June from 6pm.

However, no vehicle can be admitted without a dismantling night badge and before the top of the Organiser, who will first make sure that the Show has no more visitors. This top could happen around 8pm at the latest. Access by vehicle will be given first and exclusively for half an hour to the Organiser's Handling Pool, then to all beneficiaries of a dismantling night badge - see below. Access to the Static Display will still be prohibited until the end of aircraft evacuation manoeuvres, between 9pm and 10pm at the latest.

The official dismantling begins on Monday 24 June at 7am with the same rules as those applied to assembly.

Dismantling night Badge:

It is issued exclusively by the Build-up Office and replaces all other vehicle badges. The request must be justified for sensitive equipment, for example, and may not be made for vehicles over 3.5T, with the exception of furniture (19T) or the Handling Pool (any tonnage). Its duration of use is limited to 23 June from 7.30 pm (at best) to midnight.

5 PROHIBITION OF ANY NON-AUTHORISED COMMERCIAL ACTIVITY



5.1 Hawking and the distribution of prospectuses



The sale of any goods and/or services within or beside the Show or in its car parks, and the distribution of tracts, leaflets and other printed material or panels by Exhibitors is strictly forbidden.

The resale of tickets or any other kind of admission document is forbidden and may incur legal action from the PAS.

5.2 Camera shots, recordings and copies



Any images, videos, sounds or photographs recorded by Exhibitors within the Show compound may only **be used for strictly personal and non-commercial purposes**, unless the PAS has granted specific written authorisation beforehand.

In addition, any non-accidental and repeated photographs of the security systems of the Show or an Exhibitor could entail the intervention of the police, the confiscation of the images and/or videos and permanent exclusion from the site.

6 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR EXHIBITORS



- ▶ Take good note on our website (www.siae.fr) of **safety/security measures**, which may change in real time, and the weather forecast.
- ▶ Anticipate these measures and factor them **into your visit**.

▶ Three main entrances are available:



- ▶ For the Show car parks and shuttles. **Please note that this Gate is not directly accessible from the outside of the Exhibition Centre**; you will need to go through the car parks or take a shuttle to access it.



- ▶ Accessible to pedestrians from the car parks.



- ▶ Accessible to pedestrians on the public highway. **Please note that no deliveries can be made immediately next to this Gate** for security reasons. Do not make an appointment at Gate O, to give badges to a guest, if the latter arrives by transport or Exhibitor/Visitor car parks. He'll have no way of meeting you at Gate O without a badge. Shuttles and car parks give access to Gate L (and Gate L4 for car parks only). He will be forced to leave the site to reach Gate O, which is more than a kilometre away.

 **Gate East is closed this year.**

WARNING The other accesses are to be found in the **Access & Traffic guide**.


All gates have a **double security measure**: in the gate and upstream of it.
